

School Goals


CHS aims to improve the percentage of 9th graders finishing the year on-track to graduate, including a credit in math and language arts.

CHS will continue to focus on our on-time graduation rate with particular emphasis on SPED and ELL students.

The activities to support these goals include: targeted intervention classes, supported Algebra 1 and Geometry, Sheltered ELA and History, team taught American Literature classes, weekly advisor classes, Summer School, AVID, after-school tutoring, and a dedicated Student Success Coach.

Students earning a high school diploma or GED within five years. Cohort Includes students who were first-time ninth graders in 2018-19 finishing in 2022-23.




State Goals







